1	TO ALLOW FAKENHAM POLICE TO GIVE A REPORT PC Dawson sent a report on the Coronavirus restrictions and crime figures. There has been a dramatic increase in telephone and courier scams. PC Dawson urged anyone who has been a victim of this to contact the police. Any breaches of Coronavirus regulations should be reported via 101 where extra resource has been put in place, or online on the Constabulary website. There is a dedicated Covid-19 reporting button there.	
2	To ADJOURN THE MEETING FOR ELECTORS QUESTIONS The issue of the Thursday Market being re-opened was raised and how this will work. The market will be partially opened from Thursday 21 st May 2020. The Clerk explained that NNDC have agreed to open the toilets on Bridge Street whilst the market is open, the traders are set-up as regards social distancing. Banners and A boards will be put up reminding people to keep 2 metres apart, risk assessments have been done, and the insurance company have confirmed that FTC are insured for this to go ahead. The situation will be monitored.	
3	TO ALLOW 10 MINUTES FOR DISTRICT/COUNTY COUNCILLORS TO ADDRESS THE MEETING Cllr Rest sent a report – He has been attending twice weekly meetings via zoom with the leader of NNDC to get current updates on District issues. The coastal car parks are still closed at the request of the police and some parish councils but regular reviews are taking place. The number of hubs helping with the coordination of the Covid-19 response has been reduced to four; Fakenham, Stalham, Sheringham and Cromer will remain. This will allow some NNDC staff to return to the office also under the government guidance people can drive to the hubs. All of the three different kinds of refuse bins have been collected on their	

allotted days .The Hempton recycle site is now operating. Cllr Rest has reported two incidents to the police, one was a threat to him for helping a resident with a food delivery and the second incident is on-going and is around very loud music being constantly played at a property with the windows open. Police and NNDC environment officer are monitoring the situation.

Cllr Cushing –As part of the response phase to Covid-19 NNDC have been distributing business support grants. It now has further discretionary grant funding to help further small traders such as arts and crafts. The planning committee is still functioning but applications are down by about 1/3. Coronavirus testing is being undertaken by the army on Highfield Road car park on a Wednesday and Thursday 10am to 4pm. The Council are now looking at the recovery phase. This involves looking at how we can get local businesses back up and working and tourism back. It is not known how long this phase will take. Mr Steve Blatch has taken up the role of Chief Executive of NNDC and is working closely with his counterpart at WNDC.

Cllr Foortse asked how people can access the testing on Highfield Road car park. Cllr Cushing will send details to the FTC office.

Cllr Cushing was thanked for his report.

Cllr Fitzpatrick – an overview of the COVID-19 response was given; the temporary mortuary facilities have not been needed, co-operation across all layers of government, voluntary sectors and good neighbours has helped ensure the most vulnerable among our neighbours have been able to access help when needed, The Norfolk assistance Scheme (NAS) has been helping people in desperate financial need. County Council staff has been working from home in most instances. Essential roadworks are continuing and extra funding has been obtained from central government to continue this work.
