82	Minute 72 – Trap Lane Depot - Still awaiting quotes for the works. Cllr Dutton has some queries regarding the fencing and area around the Depot site and will liaise with Cllr Duffy. Minute 72 – Churchyard wall near Community Centre – North Norfolk District Council (NNDC) are consulting with the Diocese of Norwich to gain permission for works on the damaged wall. Cllr Dutton reported there maybe more trees that could potentially cause damage. Minute 72 – Installation of concrete bins, the concrete bases have been laid and the bins will be placed when a forklift is available in the New Year. UPDATES: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Play equipment and repairs, and new play equipment for Millenium Park. The repairs have been ordered and are awaiting completion. A discussion followed regarding costs and funding for new play equipment. Grants are available for this. • Replacement trailer – The Clerk has the original quotes and will send these to Cllr Coates. • Minute 69 – Footpath between Millenium Park and the Junior School. The Clerk has been investigating and the path does not belong to Norfolk County Council (NCC) Highways nor NNDC. The Clerk will write again to Victory Housing as the path leads to Lancaster Avenue. • Minute 72 – Street Furniture, the Pencil Lights in the Market Place; The design of the lights and the ingress of water means they are too expensive to repair.
